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## » » Homeschool Family Classes

**Fourth Thursday of the month with some exceptions**

The Dallas Museum of Art's homeschool classes offer an interactive Museum experience for families with children ages 6–12. Parents and children learn about works of art together in the galleries, participate in hands-on activities as a family, and create a work of art together in the studio. During the program, parents learn techniques and skills for creating their own educational experiences in the gallery. Taught by Museum education staff; class size limited to forty people.

## » » Docent-Guided Visits

**Offered Tuesday–Friday at 10:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., noon, and 1:00 p.m.**

Docent-guided visits allow groups of ten or more students to learn about the Museum's encyclopedic collections and special exhibitions, with topics ranging from *The Classical World* to *Contemporary Art*. Led by trained volunteers, these visits encourage critical and creative thinking while allowing students to form meaningful connections with works of art through close looking and interactive gallery experiences, including sketching, writing, and group discussion.

Open to visitors of all ages during Museum hours, the Tech Lab in the Center for Creative Connections is a place to research works of art, share thoughts about works of art, and play with interactive programs. Workshops and special programs provide opportunities to engage in conversation with digital experts and artists, as well as experiment with technology to create original work inspired by the Museum's collections. Family workshops allow parents and children ages 6 and older to learn together while merging art and technology in creative ways. Family workshops are held on selected Saturdays throughout the year. BooksmART programs offer youth, families, educators, and adults the unique opportunity to have personal experiences with authors and illustrators and nurture their own lifelong interest in reading, writing, and creativity. Past participants have included Kate DiCamillo (*Because of Winn Dixie*, *The Tale of Despereaux*), E. L. Konigsburg (*From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E.
